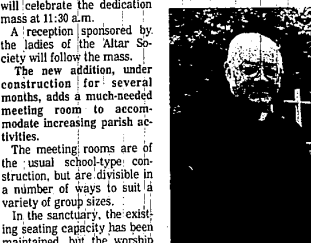
St. Aidan Plans Dedication

The new addition, under construction for several months, adds a much-needed meeting room to accommodate increasing parish activities. 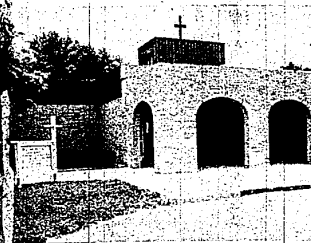

GR Baptist Sets Film

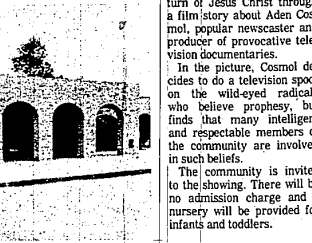

GC Presbyterian Installs Rev. Baker

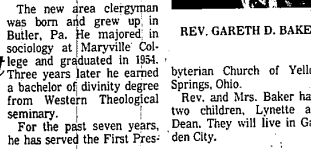
