It was a big season for Wolverine and now one will have to wait until next Au-gust to see the pacers and trotters on the mile track ... that's when Wolverine starts its first fall meeting in sev-eral years.

With business booming from the opening night, the big mile track set an all-time high for wagering with a total of \$\$4,728,518 for a nightly average of \$\$567,421. That's considerably better than, the previous high of \$\$42,000 set by Hazel Park several years back.

All told wagering was up 10 per cent over 1972 and attendance showed a hike of 4.5 per cent with a nightly average of 7,561 and a total of 619,977.
