## Banks Play Very Important Part In History Of Farmington, Nation

This is the second in a series of articles on the history and development of the Farmington community, compiled by members of the various Girl Scout and Brownie Troops in the area as part of a Scout project.

The first bank in Farmington was organized in 1892. The bank was organized by P. Dean Warner, a private banker.

In 1897 the Farmington Exchange Bank was organized with Fred M. Warner as director and president.

Making up the Board of directors of this bank in 1898 were: P. D. Warner, president; and C. Sprague, Samuel D. Holcomb, George W. Whipple, Fred M. Warner, W. B. Pearce, partner; and Clinton Wilbur, partner.

In the same year, 1898, a new brick building was erected and its growth and progress was most commendable. The bank prospered until profits grew to \$20,000 before the bank was reorganized as a State Bank on October 1, 1910. The capital paid in at the time of the organization of the bank was only \$6,000.

Executive officers of the new State Bank when first organized were: Fred M. Warner, president; S. D. Holcomb, vice president; and Clinton Wilbur, cashier. It did a general business from the time of its organization as a State Bank and was considered one of the most substantial banks in Oakland County at this time.

(The following are some general facts about banking in the United States given along with the research report on the Farmington Bank.)

Banks touch the lives of every American.

All business depends on money or credit transactions.

Years ago a small group of men could organize a bank, elect themselves directors and hire a manager. Notes were printed by State banks and used as money. Some were as good as their face value; others had so little to back them that in 1846 the Treasury was forbidden to accept any banknotes in payment of debts to the Government. In 1863 national banks were chartered that issued paper money backed by Federal bonds and for the first time paper money had a standard value in the nation.

More than 400 banks failed as a result of the panic in 1893. In 1907, only prompt financial help from the Treasury and private bankers averted widespread panic. As a result, Congress passed an Act in 1913 establishing the Federal Reserve System. Among its provisions was one calling for the pooling of reserves of banks that became members so that banking crises could be met.

Sounder banking laws were built up by the States during these years and bankers all over the

banks in the Federal Reserve System (regulated by the national Government), and to investment banking.

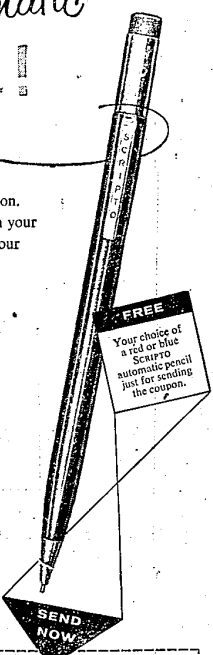
