The Roundup delegates were selected from Senior Scouts in each district because of their ability to work independently, their action and differences, a growing acceptance of responsibility for herself, and a love of company, Scout officials said.

Delegates will be in training from now until the Roundup starts. Each patrol will bring its own camping equipment and pitch and strike their own tents, establish their campsites, and cook their own meals, officials stated.

The eight girl patrols will be organized into troops of four patrols each, once the Roundup gets under way. Ten patrols will make up a camp of 300 girls. Three camps will form a Section of 960. There will be four sections in the Roundup.

Their big programs will be produced in a large outdoor amphitheater to which the public will be invited. One will be on July 4.

Scout officials said the theme of the Roundup will be "American."

BLOODMOBILE PROGRAM CHANGES TO BE DISCUSSED

Modifications in the operation of bloodmobiles will be undertaken, following a recent conference between the Detroit Regional Scout Council and the troops of eight girls each.

On the future, nurse's aides will take on the tasks of temperature taking and pulse count, releasing registered nurses for more lengthy and efficient medical histories.

Mrs. Blanchard reports that more time will now be available to check completely into a medical background of donors, to make it possible to explain the process thoroughly to donors and to insure a collection of blood that can be used.

The Center explains that volunteers never reject a donor. Medical histories are checked by registered nurses, and if the donor presents a doctor's explanation as to the donor's inability to give blood will be given by a doctor. More time will now be available for this, if the chapter can get more volunteers.

At the regional meeting, the Center explained the use of blood fractions. "1- or 10 uses units of blood at a time, and longer can be used as whole blood. The Center points out that the life of a pint of blood is 21 days. After that time it must be broken down into derivatives.

Among the main derivatives are plasma, used for burns and treatment of shock, fibrinogen used in cases of difficult child birth, and serum albumin in treatment of kidney disorders and burns.
