U-M Doubles Enrollment In Decade, Report Shows

The University of Michigan's student enrollment has nearly doubled in the past decade, official university figures indicate.

Where only 11,800 students attended classes there at the end of World War II, 20,800 are enrolled in the current semester. By 1970, when the post-war "baby boom" hits college, that figure will probably double again, hitting an estimated 40,000.


