

Farmington Thinclads Take First With Ease In Triangular Meet

The Farmington thinclad team "walked off" with top place in a triangular meet with Van Dyke and Center Line at Van Dyke on Thursday, April 17. The meet was almost no contest from the start with Farmington garnering eight firsts out of a total of 13 events. Center Line got three and Van Dyke got two. Farmington also scored five seconds and three thirds.

The final score was Farmington 53, Center Line 29, and Van Dyke 33. Vitruvino (CL) took first in the high hurdles. Wright (VD) was second, Fulton (F) was third and Stafford (VD) was fourth. Farmington's medley team, consisting of Rogers, LeSage, Agee, and Mroek, ran away with the race, followed by Center Line.

Kosty (F) and Brewbaker (F) were first and second respectively in the 100 yard dash with the winning time of 11.1. Shirchak (CL) was third and Matz (VD) was fourth.

In the mile event, Farmington once again finished 1-2 with Hamilton (F) first and Spicer second, Croton (VD) was third and Sabo (CL) was fourth.

Oliver (F) took the 440, followed by Leeoff (VD), Butler (F) and Heberline (CL). Vitruvino (CL) once again took the hurdles followed by Wright (VD), Fulton (F), and Stafford (VD).

Brewbaker and Kosty reversed the 100 yard finish but still finished 1-2 in the 220. They were fol-

lowed by Matz (CL) and Shirchak (CL). Shuster (F) finished first in the 880 on another beautiful run. He was followed by Hurst (VD), Folio (CL) and Mathews (CL). Van Dyke took first in the 360 relay, followed by Farmington and Center Line.

The pole vault was taken by Fulton (F), followed by Byrne (F). Fulton tied for second with a Center Line vaulter. Van Dyke was fourth.

Don Nichols (F) took the high jump at 5' 9". His best out Shirchak (CL) who jumped 5' 7". Day of Van Dyke took third. Farmington was shut out in the broad jump and shot put, with Shirchak (CL) first, Thorpe (VD) second and Vitruvino (CL) third and Van Dyke fourth in the broad jump.

Van Dyke took first in the shot put with Center Line second, third and fourth.

The scoring was 5 for first, 3 for second, 2 for third, and 1 for fourth.

High point men for Farmington were Fulton, 9; Kosty and Brewbaker with 8 apiece; and Nichols and Shuster with 5 apiece.

Vitruvino with 12, and Shirchak with 11 led for Center Line. Wright with 6 led Van Dyke. The next meet for Farmington is the Howell Invitational at Howell at 7:00 p.m. Friday, April 20.

The Clarencville Trojan baseball team chalked up an impressive 9-1 victory over the Farmington Falcons in a game played Friday afternoon at the Farmington High School diamond. This was the opening contest of the season for both schools.

A homer in the second inning by Roy Carlton with the bases empty gave the Trojans their first tally. In the fourth frame Dale Devitt belted out another four-bagger with one on to give the Trojans a 3-0 lead.

The Falcons scored their lone run in the bottom half of the fourth on a double by McDonald and a single by Fick.

In the fifth frame the Trojans added a single run for a 4-1 lead going into the final inning. In the last frame the Trojans staged a scoring spree, giving them the lopsided victory.
