### Polio Vaccine Supply Increasing

Farmington area residents are advised that the supply of Salk polio vaccine in the County is slowly increasing as had been anticipated by Dr. John D. Monroe, medical director of the Oakland County Department of Health. However, patience and cooperation from parents are still necessary, he said.

Vaccine is being released to private physicians to accommodate patients who have been on waiting lists for some time. It is hoped that vaccine will be available for two injections by June 15 for all who wish it, he states.

The so-called "polio season" in Oakland County does not begin until mid-July, allowing sufficient time to build antibodies following the injections.

In answer to many queries concerning third or booster doses of vaccine, the Michigan State Health Department has requested that all vaccine be used for only the first two injections. The aim is to protect as many children as possible for a few. Third injections may safely be postponed until an adequate supply is available.

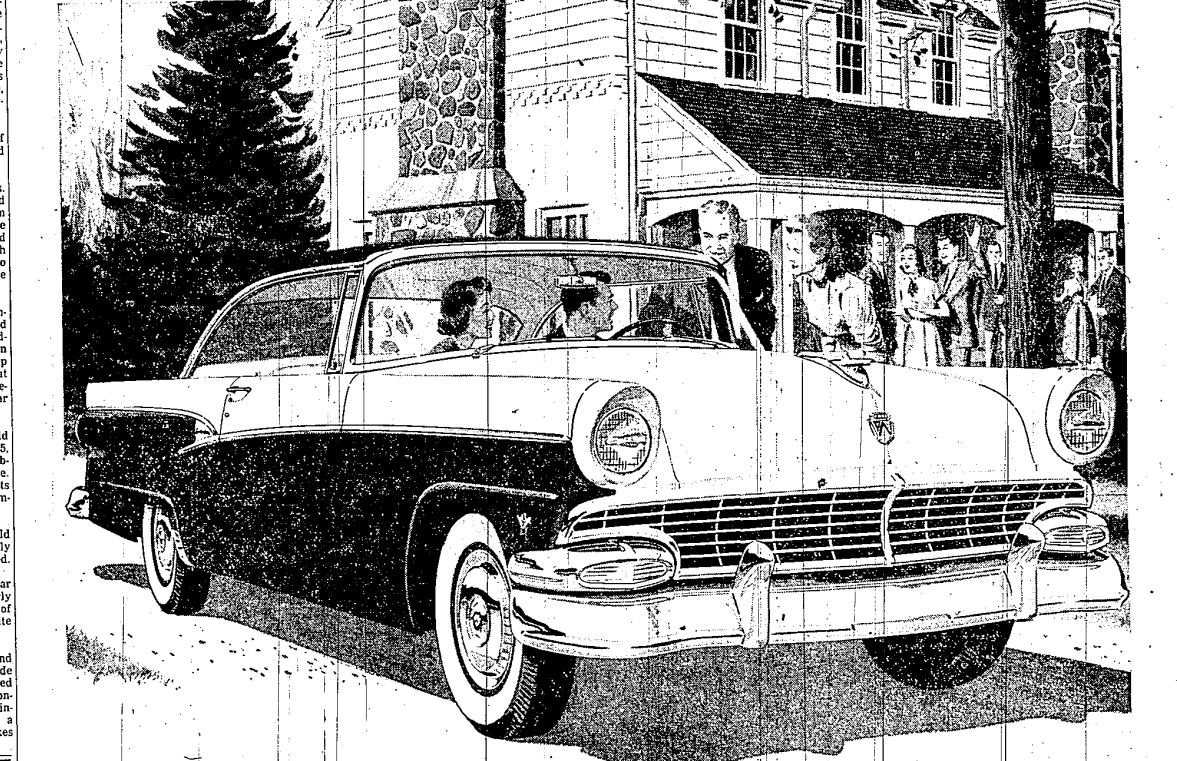
