New Presbyterian Church Branch To Open May 6

The Lincoln School near Farmington Road and Five Mile Road in Livonia has been chosen as the site for the new Livonia Branch of the Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church, Detroit. Permission to meet in that vicinity has been granted by the Detroit Council of Churches, according to the pastor, Rev. Bartlett L. Hess, Ph.D.

The first services of the new church will commence on Sunday, May 6. At 9:00 a.m. a morning worship service will be held, followed by a Bible School with classes for all ages at 10:15 a.m. Dr. Aiden Van Ginn, a dentist who resides at 4246 W. Maple, Plymouth, will teach the adult class. Some of the other teachers of the Bible School will be Joe Meinhard of 6995 Kintola, Redford Township; Andrew Matter of 9914 Shady-side, Livonia; Mr. and Mrs. William Roberts of 28923 Minton, Livonia; Mr. and Mrs. James Doonan of 12932 Wormer, Redford Township; Mr. and Mrs. Fred Stenning of 9296 Virginia, Livonia; and Mr. and Mrs. Frank Allen of 21632 Folkstone Drive, Farmington.

Dr. Hess and Rev. Charles C. Hagen will speak at the 9:00 a.m. worship services. Dr. Hess became pastor of Ward Memorial Church, Detroit, February 1, after ministering over thirteen years to the Warren Park Presbyterian Church in Cicero, Illinois. During that time the church grew from less than 400 to over 1,200 members. He also organized three churches in Chicago suburbs. He holds the B.A. degree from Park College, M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Kansas in History; B.D. degree from McCormick Theological Seminary. He and Mrs. Hess traveled and studied in Europe in 1930 and 1935. Dr. Hess visited the Bible lands of Greece, Turkey, Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Israel, Iraq and Egypt in 1932. The Hesses have four children: the youngest are twins, nine years old.

The Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church, located at Plymouth and Steel in Detroit, is about 30 years old with a congregation of over 1,500 members and a Bible school enrolling over 1,400.

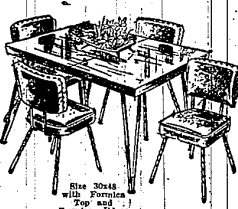

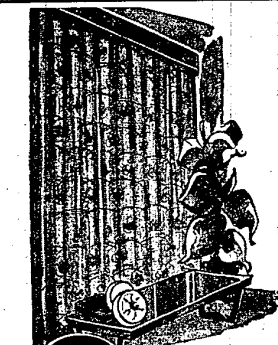
