Sue Andrews Wins Honor Scholarship

Announcement was made this week by Taylor University officials of the awarding of a Selective Honor Scholarship to Sue Andrews, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jay H. Andrews of 26925 Metroview, Farmington.

Miss Andrews will begin her college training at the university, located at Upland, Indiana, beginning with the fall semester of the 1956-57 school year.

The Selective Honor Scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic record, character and citizenship. University officials stated. The scholarship is an award of \$600 for four years at Taylor University and is applied to educational costs at the rate of \$150 per year.

Liberal arts, teacher training, and pre-professional courses are offered at the university, officials stated. Taylor, which is accredited by the North Central Association, has students in attendance from 35 different states and several foreign countries. Until 1921 the university was affiliated with the Methodist Church, but since that time has been operated as an interdenominational and independent college.
