Local Library Report Reveals Rapid Growth

Rapid Growth

The Farmington City and Township library has had an interesting and healthy growth during his past year, officials pointed out in a report this week.

During the past 12 months the librarians have circulated 27,708 books per month. As the library is open 4th hous, per week of the control of the circulation in relation to city and township during 1933-54; 1984-55; and the four months of 1986 runs; city, 41 plus per cent and township, 38 plus per cent of the books circulated. The circulation has increased 44 per cent since December 31, 1985 and upward trend of 1045 flew readers during the past ten months.
