Tickets for the rodeo may be purchased locally from any Clarenceville Optimist Club member or may be obtained at the gate.

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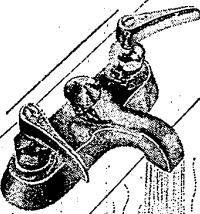

Driver Training Gains Momentum

Thirty-two Clarenceville High School pupils are expected to receive state-approved certificates in driver training under the new Michigan law which took effect at the beginning of the second semester, school officials announced last week.

It was indicated that 31 pupils and 33 adults were trained during the first semester at the school prior to the effective date of the new law.

Driver training instructions were provided this year at Clarenceville High School by Anthony Marra, Warren LaClair and Nick Ianni in a four-door, dual control car loaned to the school by Tenney Chevrolet, Inc. of Livonia.

Since the new law went into effect, school officials stated, the demand for the course has been doubled. To satisfy the demand an additional class period was added and the services of one more instructor has been obtained on a part-time basis.

In our country labor is free, free to organize, free to bargain collectively, free to choose, to seek, and to quit a job. All of us must be alert and wary of encroachments on this great freedom — which has been a key factor in making America the most wonderful nation on earth.

According to Don Weeks, director of the development office, other states spent more than \$3,000,000 last year in an effort to secure new industry.

"We are pleased that Michigan will now have a coordinated campaign to promote the state's virtues," Weeks stated. "We anticipate that the state government's \$100,000 fund will be multiplied several times through tie-in arrangements by numerous companies and organizations."

A five-phase program is outlined, according to Weeks, which includes advertising in national consumer and trade journals, traveling displays, a Michigan movie, a television film and direct mail advertising.

Michigan residents, most of whom have a stake in the state's economic growth, can help by plugging Michigan's advantages at every opportunity as an excellent location for industry. A successful campaign would provide through new industry more jobs for state residents and added money for the retail businessman.

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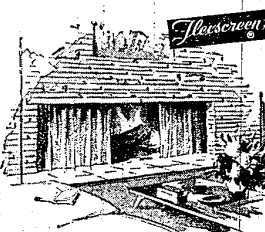
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
