Westbrook Fourth Grade
Takes Trip To Lansing

Upon completion of their studies on transportation and Michigan, the fourth grade class of the Westbrook School took an educational study trip to Lansing recently.

A total of 32 children, 8 mothers and the teacher took the trip which was made partly by train and partly by bus. An interesting finding was made when it was learned that 25 of the children had never ridden on a train prior to that time and 22 had never ridden on a bus.

At Lansing the group visited the Capitol Building and the Michigan Historical Museum. Of the 32 students making the trip, only two indicated that they had ever visited the Capitol Building previously.

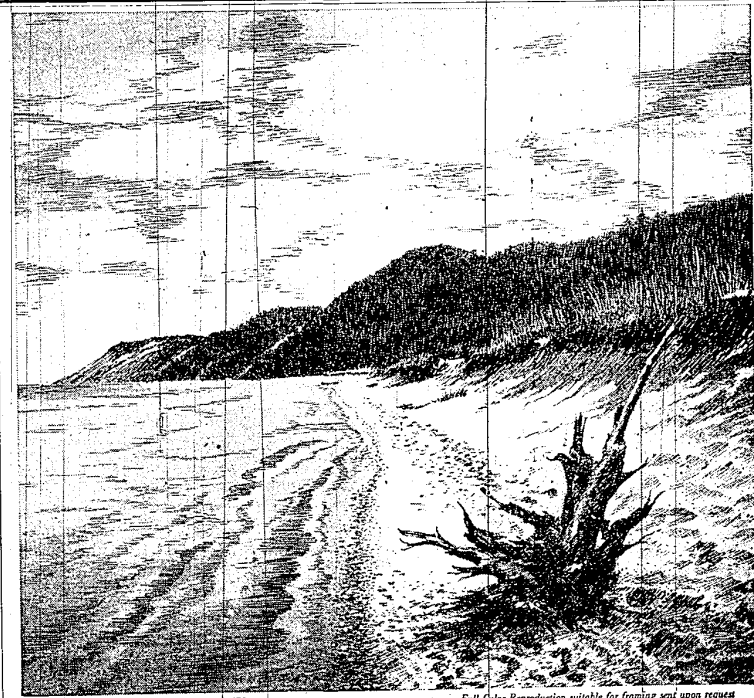
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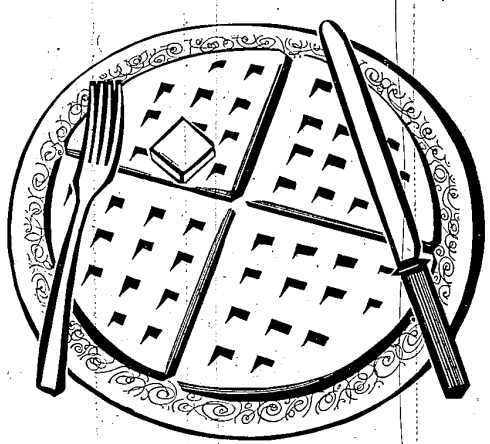
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
