Teams will swing into regular scheduled play on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays beginning on Monday, June 16.

Little League Sets Double-Header

All four teams in the Farmington Little League circuit will be in action this Saturday in a double-header in the third round of play in the loop.

The Little League is made up of 60 select boys, 15 on each team, while an additional group of approximately 300 boys make up the farm teams. Boys on the farm teams are trained and given experience before being moved up into the Little League team rosters.

The first in a series of rodeos to be presented throughout the summer in Detroit is now under way at Grand River and Seven Mile Road. Performances in this first rodeo of the series, which started Wednesday, will continue through Sunday.

He made his first appearance Wednesday night and will appear again this Thursday and Friday evenings and in Maizee on Saturday and Sunday afternoon. Dick Ryan, one-time Michigan cavalryman and veteran rodeo producer, is presenting this summer series of rodeos under the sponsorship of the Optimist Clubs of metropolitan Detroit. Shows will be staged Wednesday through Sunday of each week, Ryan said, and will feature calf roping, bareback and saddle riding, bull riding and all the tricks normally associated with a wild west show.
