NOTICE OF SPECIAL TOWNSHIP MEETING AND ELECTION

AND OF REGISTRATION OF VOTERS

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, held on the 12th day of June, 1956, a franchise ordinance was adopted, entitled as follows:

AN ORDINANCE, granting to CONSUMERS POWER COMPANY, its successors and assigns, the right, power and authority to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges, and other public places, and to do a local gas business in the TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN for a period of thirty years.

WHEREAS, said Consumer Power Company has heretofore filed its written acceptance of said franchise, and has requested that the question of confirming the grant thereof be submitted to the qualified electors of the Township, at a special election to be held for that purpose, and has also paid to the Township Board the estimated expense of holding such special election; and,

WHEREAS, there has been heretofore filed with said Board, a petition signed by at least twelve electors, requesting that a special township meeting and election be called for such purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to resolutions adopted by said Board, notice is hereby given that a special meeting and election will be held in said Township at:

Precinct No. 2 - Fire Department No. 3, 21420 Wheeler
