BROADWAY HITS
TO BE PRESENTED
AT NORTHLAND

The Northland Playhouse, a new 1500-seat theatre to be erected at the northeast corner of Northland Center off Greenfield Road, will open a season of Broadway hit comedies and dramas on June 20.

Top-ranking stars of Broadway, Hollywood and television are scheduled to appear in the productions. Officials indicated that such personalities as Charlton Heston, Eva Gabor, Tullulah Bankhead, Chico Marx, Vincent Price and Judith Anderson will appear. The all-professional company is being cast in New York.

Playhouse blueprints call for a theatre-in-the-round, with a central stage, surrounded by the tiered seats. The Kroger Company is co-sponsoring the Northland Playhouse.

Producer of Northland Playhouse is Kenneth E. Schwartz, 33-year-old native Detroit, World War II Merchant Marine officer, and graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York City. Schwartz's ground-work for his Northland Playhouse venture includes five years of summer theatre experience.

Schwartz learned the business side of theatre while house manager for the American National Theatre Academy during its production of "Galileo" with Charles Laughton; "Skipper Next to God," with the late John Garfield; and "Temporary Island," with Vera-Elaine and Ernest Truex.

To bring Northland Playhouse into existence, Schwartz rallied the civic spirit and financial support of a sizeable group of Detroit business and professional people.

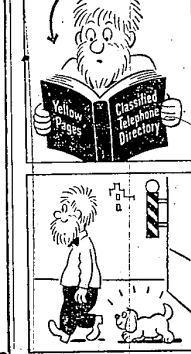
