HOUGHTON LAKE 'LOADED' WITH FISH, SURVEY REVEALS
Houghton Lake's reputation as a fishing "hot spot" was confirmed by a recently-completed evaluation of the lake's fish populations. Conservation Department fish workers operated trap nets in all parts of the lake last year to gather information for the study. The number of fish trapped per day was more than twice as great as it was for other lakes, both large and small, checked in a similar manner.
In terms of fish-per-acre, the Houghton Lake survey showed about 100 catchable fish per acre, considerably exceeding the 45 to 100 (larger-sized fish per acre estimated to be present in other inland lakes).
Houghton Lake, the state's largest inland body of water, covers more than 20,000 acres in Roscommon County.
The lake's catch of pan fish to other less-desirable species indicated a fish population structure which should continue to provide good fishing.
Growth rates of bluegills, pumpkinseeds, black crappies, rock bass and largemouth and small-mouth bass were considerably better than the statewide average for those species. For the walleye, however, growth rate was below average for other North American waters.

Seek Site, Study Plans For New Northwest YWCA

With an allocation of \$500,000 from the Detroit Building Fund to erect a YWCA building in northwest Detroit, YWCA officials are studying plans for the new structure.

Mrs. Ivan Lindblade, 16728 Glastonbury, Detroit, is chairman of the building committee of Northwest Branch YWCA, which now makes its quarters in a small two-room building at 17268 Redford Avenue. Members of her committee are considering such matters as the site of the proposed building, facilities offered by the neighborhood in which it will be located, architectural plans, and furnishings.

The building committee's survey was begun last February, immediately following election of officers for the Branch.

"Since then," said Mrs. Lindblade, "members of our committee have driven all over northwest Detroit, looking for a suitable site for our building. They have literally covered almost every street within the boundaries served by Northwest Branch—from Joy Road to Fourteen Mile Road, from Haggerty Road to Northwestern Highway, from Haggerty Road to Greenfield—back and forth, up and down, checking on sites to meet our basic requirements, which is a lot from three and a half to five acres in size."

As prospective sites have been located, other members of the committee have made surveys of the neighborhoods surrounding them.

"We want our new building to be convenient to the 200,000 people in this area who will want our services," Mrs. Lindblade said. "Consequently, factors we must consider include road transportation to the building, a location accessible to the entire area, the facilities for outdoor activities such as golf, tennis and swimming, and even shopping areas."

The type of architecture must also be considered from the long view, she pointed out.

"We must try to determine what kind of program the Northwest Branch will carry on during the next twenty years," she said. "It's easy to understand that the type of activities will determine what facilities we need in the building, what kind of rooms we should have, and even the sizes of the rooms."

Fourteen thousand northwest Detroiters—men, women and children—participated in activities at Northwest Branch YWCA last year. The Northwest YW, although only four years old, has a membership of 4,500 women.

In making their study of the area, the building committee has conferred with township and city officials, with city and regional planning officials, and with officials of the department of Parks and Recreation.

Ed. Moesman, a member of the recently-appointed Board of Trustees for the City and Township Library, gave a first-hand report on the progress of the board.

Clarence Stoll, treasurer, reported membership dues receipts of over \$100 from the recent drive for renewal of memberships. He also revealed new book gifts in the amount of \$5.00. The group voted to transfer \$100 from the general fund to the gift fund, bringing it to a total of \$508.

A vote of appreciation was expressed to Clara Grace and to Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Hoofnagle, who contributed to the gift fund when making their membership dues payments. A vote of appreciation was also extended to Howard Warner, president of the Farmington State Bank, following the disclosure by Samuel H. Kosmenschky that bank had volunteered to underwrite all printing costs for news letters, announcements and other communications sent out by the organization during the coming year.

At the close of the meeting refreshments were served by Mrs. Droegge.

The next meeting of the Friends of the Library will be held on July 10.
