Naomi McClung Touring
Europe With School Choir

Naomi McClung, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. McClung of Castlemeadow Drive, Farmington, was among a group of 40 members of the Wheaton Academy A Capella choir, a high school branch of Wheaton College, leaving the United States last week for a six week concert tour of Great Britain and other European countries.

The teen-age choir, along with choir director Diane W. Benjamin and seven other adults, left Idlewild Airport in New York Thursday, June 14, on a chartered Royal Dutch Airlines plane.

Concerts have been scheduled for their itinerary with their first concert scheduled for the Royal Festival Concert Hall, newly erected and seating more than 3,000 people. Other Great Britain appearances will be held in churches and concert halls in Cockfosters, Walthamstow, Richmond, Manchester, Leeds, Bradford, London, Aberdeen, Dundee, Paisley, Ayr, Tullibouly, Edinburgh, Lancaster, Blackpool, Liverpool, Preston, Rhy, Cardiff, and Hove.

Concerts will also be presented in Holland, Germany, and Switzerland.

The choir made a radio-television appearance on June 16 at the variety and will make another on July 23 at Belser.

The group plans to fly from Amsterdam on July 30, arriving at Idlewild Airport in New York on July 31. They will embark from there by bus for Akron, Ohio, where they will be in concert the evening of August 1 in the newly built Capitol on Fir Hill where Dr. Carl Burnham, father of Wheaton's three-time Little All-American football star, Dave Burnham, shares the pulpit with his predecessor son.

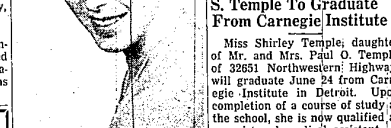
