

Summer Band Schedule Revealed

The schedule for the Farmington Summer Band Program, both junior and senior high school students was disclosed this week by R. H. Zimmerman, instrumental music instructor.

Junior High band instructions will be given each morning, Monday through Friday, from 9 to 10 a.m.; beginning band instructions each morning between 10 and 11 a.m. and High School instructions each day between 11 a.m. and 12 noon. Classes will be offered in band twirling between 1 and 2 p.m. each afternoon.

Students in all groups playing wind instruments will meet on Mondays and Wednesdays and students playing brass and percussion instruments on Tuesdays and Thursdays. On Fridays all band students in each group will meet together.

The Farmington Community Band will meet each Monday evening from 7:30 to 9 p.m. Zimmerman stated he also indicated that all adults would be welcomed to play in the Community Band.

Planned for Tuesday evenings this summer are trips to hear various symphony orchestras and city park bands play.

The Summer Band program will be concluded on August 3, with band students taking their annual trip to Bob-Lo Island, Zimmerman stated.

Seeks Nomination To County Office

Daniel W. Barry, native of Oak and lifelong resident of Pontiac and Waterford Township, today announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for Oakland County Drain Commissioner in the August primary.

Barry, 33, resides with his wife at 1851 Orchard Street. He is an Army Chemical Warfare Service veteran of World War II. He served 3 1/2 years, including a year in the South Pacific with the 19th Bombardment Group.

He left Pontiac High School in 1942 for his Army service and was graduated in 1949 from Michigan State University, East Lansing. He holds a B.A. degree in business and public service, and is now working for his master's degree in public administration.

Barry has been an active Republican worker since his high school days but this is his first bid for public office. He has mapped an intensive county-wide campaign for the drain commissioner nomination and announces he is ready to appear before groups throughout the county.

McGuire Seeks 18th District Seat

Announcement of the candidacy of Thomas F. McGuire for the 18th District of Congress on the Republican ticket was disclosed recently.

McGuire, who makes his home at 8832 Woodside Park Drive in Oak Park, has had considerable governmental experience. He was Assistant Deputy Administrator for the NRA in Washington, D.C., for 3 years, supervisor of operations for the Michigan State Employment Service in (Oakland, Wayne, Washtenaw and Macomb Counties 2 years and with the U.S. Department of Labor in Michigan and Ohio for 4 years. He also served in the U.S. Negotiation Board in the Michigan, Ohio, New York and Pennsylvania District for 2 1/2 years.

For 2 years McGuire was in Washington, D.C., as a liaison between the White House and the House and Senate on the Social Security Act, National Industrial Recovery Act, Fair Labor Standards Act, and Standby Acts covering the emergency following Pearl Harbor. In this grouping was included work with Emergency Management, the War Production Board, Defense Transportation, O.P.A. and Area War Labor Board, War Manpower and the Office of War Information. He also served two years in Lansing and Washington with the Motion Pictures Theaters Industry and for 3 years as a member of the Consumers' Advisory Board.

McGuire has been an industrial engineer and management consultant for ten years, a manufacturer representative in Michigan, Illinois and Wisconsin for one year and a real estate broker for one year. He has been president of the Businessmen's Association for 2 years, Trade Association executive in Michigan for 2 years and was founder and first president of the Knights of Equity in Washington, D.C. He is presently a member of the National Association of Manufacturers' Agents, has been a Board of Commerce member for 10 years and a member of the Economics Club for five years.

McGuire's educational background included post-graduate work in labor relations, public relations, industrial psychology, labor law and administrative procedures. He is married and the father of four children, three girls and a boy.

Geological Records Of Rock Strata Available

Detailed geological records of rock formations in various parts of Michigan recently have been compiled by the Conservation Department's geological survey division.

Information on the rock formations has been gathered during thousands of well-drilling operations in the state during the last 25 years. Drill cuttings from each well were analyzed and recorded, along with core descriptions.

An inventory, listing the sample logs and core descriptions available, has been compiled by Beverly L. Champion and Robert H. Edwards of the Conservation Department.

The inventory is designed to assist geologists and laymen who are working subsurface formations. The logs included in the inventory are more detailed and informative than the average driller's log.

The complete listing of records available can be obtained for 50¢ from the Conservation Department, Lansing 20.
