DISTALLINE SAFETY TIPS OFFERED

If a motor trip is included in your vacation plans for this summer, chances are that you will spend some share of your travel time on a superlighway. A lease time and attonal magazing rules to help you avoid an accident.

1. Keep your speedometer at a familiar speed, one you're used to and can handle. Slow down for bad weather or bad road conductions. Observe signs reducing speed limits.

2. Brive conservatively in all respects. Nearly 22% of turnpike accidents are eaused by falliure to observe ordinary driving rules. Stay at least 20 feet, or a correction of the property of the prop

tience, Burst of speed, excessive use of brakes, bumper riding, cutting. In the state of the side strip, making sure all the wheels are off the paving. If you need help-on a turnpike, hang a white. handkerchief from the window. Don't cross or walk on the highway or attempt to flag down cars.

6. Slow down as you approach tollgates and before turning for the station entrances. Remember that the usual exit ramp is designed for a speed of 25 mph.

7. Stay awake, really awake. Stop for coffee frequently or pull off the road for a cat map if you are sleepy. Avoid highway hypnosis by watching everything that is happening on the road ahead of you.

8. Don't use the rear lights of rucks as a driving guide at night, and, don't risk driving a car with open tires or in poor mechanical condition.
