The regulator, called gibberelli acid, makes plants grow faster and mature sooner than usual with no harmful effects, according to Sylvan Wittwer, MSU hordiculture researcher.

He has worked with H. M. Sell, Paricultural chemists, and M. J. Bukovac, hoffscitture graduset student, to test the acid on peas, beans, celery, cabbage, broccoff, peppers, watermelon, sweet corn, head and leaf lettuces, squash, cu-cumbers and carrots.
