

Governor's Trot At Northville Downs Set Aug. 1

The annual \$10,000 Governor's Cup Trot will be held Wednesday, August 1, at Northville Downs. It will come three nights before the closing of Northville's 13th season on Saturday night, August 4.

Governor C. Mennen Williams will make his first appearance at the Downs this season to present the trophy to the winner. Racing Secretary Harry Hatch reports that ten horses were entered for this classic event. There will be two entries: Excell and Johnnie Averill and the other of Mr. Shelt, the Ohio-Kentucky champion, and Little Dan. Other nominations are Elby Hanover, Lord Pick, Rhythmic, Senior Imperial, Gallon, Lord Stewart and Scotch Valley.

The free for all will be raced in two dashes of one mile each. The first racing for the Governor's Cup at Northville was in 1945.

Thoroughbred Races Open Aug. 1

On August 1 thoroughbreds will burst from the starting gate to open a 58-day racing season at the Detroit Race Course, Schoolcraft and Middlebelt tracks, Livonia.

Four more stakes races have been added to last season's schedule of seven, making a total of 11 such events for the 1958 meeting. Topping the list will be the eighth annual running of the \$50,000 added Michigan Mile, the state's richest race, on September 15.

Other important stakes events slated are the \$10,000 added Col. F. M. Alger Memorial Handicap on August 4, the \$15,000 added Wolverine Stakes on September 3 (Labor Day), and the \$20,000 added Frontier Handicap, which closes the season on October 6.

The stakes schedule represents a distribution of \$175,500 out of an approximate total of \$1,200,000 for the entire meeting. The minimum purse for any race is \$2,000.

Eight races will be run daily except Opening Day, Labor Day, and all Saturdays. Nine races will be held on each of those days.

Post time is 2:45 p.m. on week days and 2 p.m. on nine-race days.
