Survey Reveals Pattern In Changing Churches

Churchgoers who change their religious affiliation tend to follow a definite pattern, Michigan State University researchers have reported.
A pilot study of Lansing churches indicates a person choosing a new church tends to select one which occupies a middle position between those most unlike and those most similar to his original denomination.
Dr. Milton Rokeach of the MSU psychology department and his assistants surveyed changes only in selected churches with a relatively stable membership. They consider their findings preliminary to further research in beliefs and related measurement systems.
"It must be remembered that we are speaking of tendencies," Prof. Rokeach cautioned. "Not all persons will make the same

choice given the same circumstances. But, on the whole, we believe a greater number of people will act this way than will not."
