Planning Board Suggests Action

The Farmington Township Planning Board at its regular meeting Monday evening entered a recommendation that the Township Board approve plans for Holly Hills Farm Subdivision but reject a request for rezoning to commercial a strip of frontage on the west side of Orchard Lake Road south of 14 Mile Road.

The rezoning request, made by developers for the proposed San Juan Gardens Subdivision development to the west, was recommended for rejection because of a strong indication that strip zoning along any main thoroughfare is undesirable. It was also pointed out that a commercial area as large as that proposed would be in excess of the commercial area determined to be needed in relationship to total population for that area.

The remainder of the meeting was devoted to a detailed study and discussion of material relative to overall Township planning and development presented by George Velican, Township planning consultant.
