Teachers Training In Local Schools

The Farmington Public Schools are again this year cooperating with Wayne State University in the training of teachers under the University Intensive Teacher Education Program.

College graduates may prepare for teaching under this program by following an intensive schedule of courses in the field of education and doing practice teaching in one of the neighboring school systems under the supervision of the school administration and the university. This program has proven to be very successful and has contributed a large number of fine teachers to the profession, school officials indicated.

During the current semester two elementary teachers are assigned in Farmington — one in Grade 2 at Bond and one in Grade 1 at Ten Mile.

The job directed teaching is also being given two members of the teaching staff through Wayne and three through the University of Detroit. In addition the future student at the University of Detroit is assigned to Farmington for supervised teaching.

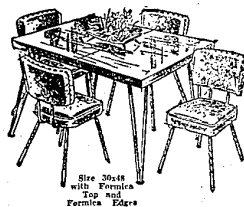
