Area Girl Scout Program Expands, Leaders Needed

The popularity of the Girl Scout program among girls is greater than ever before, Girl Scout officials emphasized.

The Southern Oakland Girl Scout Council is reported as one of the fastest growing councils in the country. In June of this year girl membership totaled 10,560 and adult volunteers 3,737, figures showed. As a member of United Community Services public contributions are made through the Oakland County Township United Fund to finance the expanding Girl Scout program. Despite this expansion, our responsibility does not end there. Over 500 girls were on the waiting list from last year, and in each new school, and new home building development there are still many more girls who wish to become Girl Scouts, officials indicated. This will be impossible unless more volunteers come forward to direct their activities, they continued.

The requirements are simple—a liking for girls and belief in the Girl Scout program is all that is needed, officials say. The Girl Scout organization takes care of the rest. A glance through the training schedule just released gives an idea of the many doors opened by Girl Scout Leadership Training.

There are five initial Brownie leadership courses, some already past and five initial Intermediate leadership courses starting September 27, October 1 and 31, January 30 and February 25. There are workshops in arts and crafts, songs, folk dancing, special training in first aid and Campercraft.

Any Girl Scout leader will agree that the personal satisfactions experienced, skills learned and opportunities for self growth more than compensate for the time and work involved, it was pointed out.

ADVENTISTS SEEK FUNDS FOR NEW TRINIDAD HOSPITAL

Members of the Clarenceville Seventh-day Adventist Church will contribute funds to help provide a new hospital in Port-of-Spain, Trinidad.

Allen Breakie, Sabbath School Superintendent, in announcing the special offering, pointed out that Trinidad is the "most disease ridden island in the Caribbean."

It was known for some time as the "White Man's Grave," he said. Seven Adventist missionaries had met their deaths there as a result of typhoid, malaria, yellow fever and other diseases which abound. Government hospitals are crowded, and the clinic which the church now operates, has been targeted twice because of the heavy influx of patients, but it cannot accommodate cases requiring hospitalization, he continued.

The Port-of-Spain hospital, when completed, will be the sixth such mission hospital operated by the denomination in Inter-America. These are part of the Adventists world medical program, which comprises 235 medical institutions, he concluded.

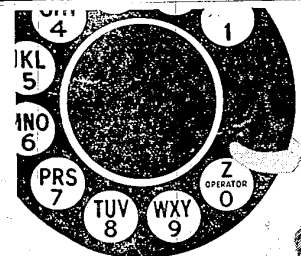

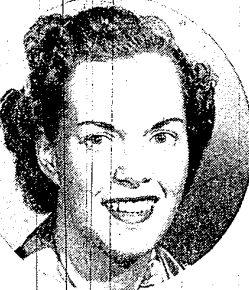

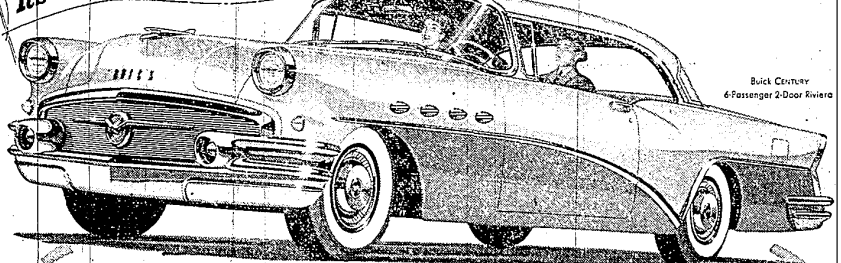
