NATIONAL BANK OF DETROIT NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETING OF SHAREHOLDERS

To Our Shareholders: We hereby advise you that, on Monday, October 15, 1956, at 12 o'clock noon, Eastern Standard Time, a special meeting of the Board of Directors, a special meeting of the shareholders of the National Bank of Detroit, will be held in the Conference Room on the 11th floor of the National Bank Building, 1000 Woodward Avenue and Cadillac Square, Detroit, Michigan, to consider and vote upon the following proposals and matters incidental thereto which properly may come before that meeting:

1. To ratify, confirm and adopt the Agreement of Merger heretofore entered into on behalf of this Bank pursuant to authorization of the Board of Directors with the Farmington Bank of Farmington, Michigan, dated July 6, 1956, whereby the Farmington Bank will merge into this Bank pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 4 and 5 of an Act of Congress of the United States entitled "An Act to provide for the Consolidation of National Banking Institutions," approved November 7, 1938, as amended.
2. To ratify, confirm and adopt the Agreement of Merger heretofore entered into on behalf of this Bank pursuant to authorization of the Board of Directors with Peoples State Bank of Detroit, Michigan, dated August 12, 1956, whereby Peoples State Bank will merge into this Bank pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 4 and 5 of an Act of Congress of the United States entitled "An Act to provide for the Consolidation of National Banking Institutions," approved November 7, 1938, as amended.
3. To authorize the Board of Directors of this Bank to take such action and give such authorization to the officers of this Bank as may be necessary or advisable in order to determine whether the conditions precedent to the consummation of such Agreement of Merger have been satisfied, and to take such other and further action and give such other and further authorization to the officers of this Bank as may be necessary or advisable in order to carry out the provisions of each such Agreement of Merger.
4. To consider and act upon the proposals recommended by the Board of Directors of the Bank that under the provisions of Section 512 of the United States Revised Statutes, as amended, and effective upon approval by the Controller of the Currency, the common stock of the Bank which will be outstanding after the action of the shareholders with respect to the ratification, confirmation and adoption of each Agreement of Merger described in Paragraphs 1 and 2 above become non-voting, be increased to a sum which will be equal to 10% of the aggregate par value of the common stock of the Bank then outstanding by an increase equal to 10% of the number of shares of the common stock of the par value of \$10 each then outstanding, all of which additional shares shall be sold and have no vote or prior to November 30, 1956, being first offered for subscription to the holders of the common stock of the Bank in accordance with the provisions of Article 210 of the Articles of Association of the Bank, as amended.
5. For the convenience of shareholders and in order to avoid the issuance of fractional-share certificates, it is contemplated that the National Bank of Detroit will purchase or acquire shares of the common stock of the Bank to be sold to the holders of fractional shares of the common stock of the Bank in accordance with the provisions of Article 210 of the Articles of Association of the Bank, as amended, before the purchase or sale of shares to direct the purchase or sale of shares to which fractional shares are to be sold.
6. To determine the price per share at which such additional shares shall be sold.
7. To consider and act upon the proposals recommended by the Board of Directors of the Bank that, effective upon the approval by the Controller of the Currency of the issuance of such additional shares to be sold, the Articles of Association of the Bank, as amended, be further amended by amending Article 210 thereof to provide that the aggregate par value of common stock of the Bank and the number of shares of the common stock of the Bank which shall be outstanding after the issuance of such additional shares to be sold, be divided such that the aggregate par value of the common stock of the Bank shall be equal to the aggregate par value of the common stock of the Bank as it existed immediately prior to the issuance of such additional shares to be sold.
8. To transact such other business incidental to the foregoing proposals as may properly come before such meeting or any adjournment or adjournments thereof.
