Varied Recreation Program Offered

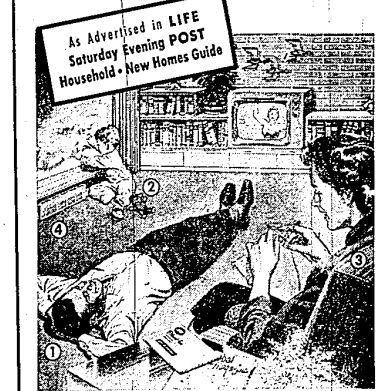
The Livonia Recreation Department is now sponsoring two classes of square dancing, and is looking forward to sponsoring a third if enough people express an interest.

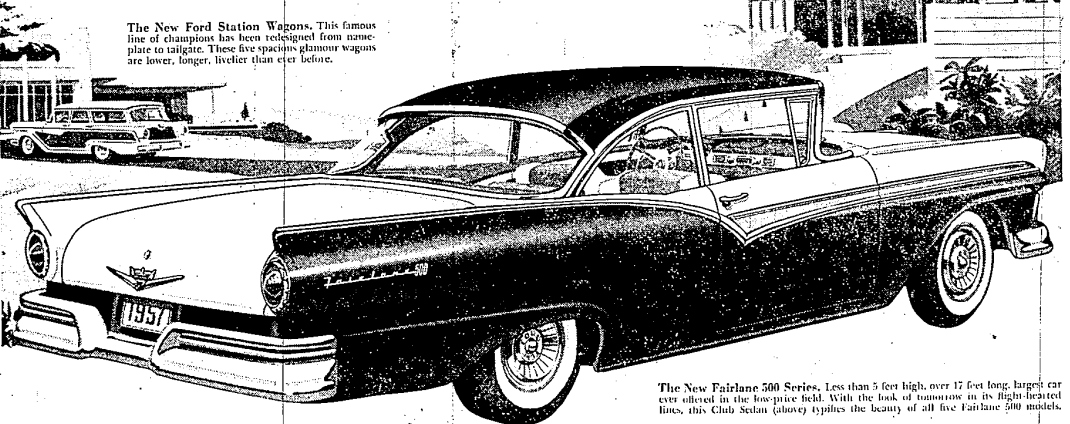
