Organization of the campaign, including solicitation in residential, commercial, professional and industrial areas, has now been completed, Walker stated. Every effort is being made to assure as complete coverage of the city and township area as possible.

### School Board

for the next school year," as requested by the Board at its last meeting was presented by Superintendent O. P. Dunkel. The report indicated that the need for additional classrooms and schools next year and in the future would definitely be greatest in the northern portion of the school district. Dunkel substantiated with figures the fact that all rooms in the proposed new Kendallwood elementary school would be needed by the beginning of the 1956-57 school year.

The report covering the entire school district also pointed out, the fact that if a conservatively estimated elementary enrollment of 430 students is correct for the beginning of the next school year all available rooms will be needed to avoid double sessions. This is based on the premise that a small German, Noble and Fairview schools will continue to be used and that all three proposed new elementary schools will be ready for occupancy by the opening of the next school year.

A request from Benjamin Frank of the Oakland County Child Guidance Clinic was made to the Board asking that they support the proposed establishment of a South Oakland County Branch Clinic. Frank stated that a formal request will be submitted to the Board in the near future.

He indicated that there is a proven need for such a clinic of this nature in the southern part of the county to provide psychiatric treatment for youngsters and their parents alike. Other school boards and governmental bodies have already pledged their utmost support, he stated.

Benjamin estimated that it would cost about \$29,000 to build and equip such a clinic. A major portion of the cost in operating these clinics is borne by the State and since the County has already pledged over \$20,000 for next year, Benjamin said, the amount to be asked from school districts should not be too large. He expressed the opinion that in the near future the entire cost of operation would probably be taken over by the County in conjunction with the state.

The Board indicated that they would give the request due consideration.

Other action taken by the Board included authorization for the obtaining of bids to construct service entrance walks at the Gilt, Shawnessee and Eagle elementary schools and approval of the resignation of Junior High Teacher Billie Harry. The Board also agreed to join the County Association of School Boards now being formed. A report of the organizational meeting held for this proposed group was presented by Trustee Leiford Clifford, who was in attendance.

Following a report of vandalism and damage to the new football field and running track at the high school caused by cars and motor bikes, it was unanimously agreed by the Board that immediate steps should be taken to prevent recurrences. A study of the situation will be made by members of the Board along with school administrators and preventive measures will be discussed in detail at the next meeting.
