Bible Comment: 'THERE WAS WAR IN HEAVEN'

"There was war in heaven." Surely heaven is the last place where one would expect war. It is a common assumption that, if we could only perfect our social conditions and environment, everything would be well. Yet here in heaven, where we think of conditions as ideal, there was war. We are reminded that as eternal vigilance is the price of liberty, so it is the price of peace. Good conditions do not guarantee suppression of evil ambitions and the lust of power. "There was war in heaven." Even in heaven, the forces and the power of evil could not be overthrown without conflict. There is a point where the appeals of grace, overcoming evil with good, and turning the other cheek, have their limitations. The power of evil has to be met with uncompromising opposition. The Christian way is a way of peace, but Michael and his angels went forth to war and there was no peace until the great dragon was cast down and forced out of heaven.
