Mr. Christian had just returned from a trip to Russia, where he helped Russ Potter film his "Flight to the Soviet," which will be an outstanding feature of the Series on February 24. Mr. Christian pointed out in an interview after the program that the coming Potter film is one in which the audience is taken beyond the Kremlin and other well-known Russian landmarks, into the suburbs and countryside and into the hearts of the Russian people.

The next Travel feature is slated for Sunday, November 11, at 4 p.m., when Dr. William G. Campbell will take his audience to "Indo-China." Moorhead said he expected an even greater turnout for this lecture and that season tickets can still be purchased at a substantial savings.
