**Bible Comment:**  
**Early Christians Set Example for Bickering Sects**

EVEN in the realm of religion and the church, success brings its problems and difficulties. As Christianity spread and grew, these problems were twofold. There was the problem of mingling races in a religion that, like its founder, was no respecter of persons. The Gospel had power to change the outlooks and lives of men, regardless of their color and their habitat. And there was the additional problem of a religion that rose among one race, with its roots and foundations in one religion becoming worldwide in its scope and application. One is impressed with the way in which these early Christians went about solving their problems. They faced the plain fact that where the Gospel was preached, Gentiles as well as Jews benefited from it. Many converts had not been brought up in the Jewish way. They did not understand the significance or the need of rites to which the Jews had been accustomed. Jewish Christians continued to practice these rites along with what they deemed their newer and larger experience. Should these practices be enjoined on the Gentile Christians? The wise leaders among the Jews said that they should not. It was agreed that the Gentiles should practice the Christian way, that they should not give offense to their Jewish brethren by obtrusive disregard of Jewish customs. Neither, however, should the Gentiles be under obligation to adopt these customs except as their own consciences direct. Would it not be well if all the problems of worldwide Christianity could be settled today upon the same wise and practical basis, and with such courteous consideration for the ideas and rights of all?

**Rev. Kellison Elected Leader Of State Universalists**

At the State Convention of Universalist Churches of Michigan, held at East Liberty on October 12 and 13, the Reverend Walter E. Kellison was elected president for the ensuing year, and the Reverend Miss Elizabeth Elz was elected Vice-President and Chairman of the State Fellowship Committee. Both Mr. Kellison and Miss Elz are from the Farmington Universalist Church.

Mr. Kellison was also appointed Superintendent of Universalist Churches of Michigan by the Executive Board of the Convention. In this capacity he will act in an advisory capacity for all Michigan Universalist churches and act as liaison for the Universalist Church headquarters centered in Boston, Massachusetts.

Before coming to Farmington this past January, Mr. Kellison was Superintendent of Universalist Churches of Maine, a position he had held since January, 1952. While in Maine he was also house manager of Perry Beach, a camp for young people.

The Reverend Miss Elz is chaplain of the Wayne County Training School located at Northville.

Reports on progress and activities were made by the various churches and plans were formulated and committees were set up for the year ahead.

Dr. Angus MacLean of the St. Lawrence Theological Seminary spoke at the closing session.

Also representing the Farmington Church at East Liberty were Mrs. Clara Wikom, Mrs. Harley Gibson, of Farmington, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Baxter of Plymouth and Mrs. R. T. Costello of Orchard Lake.

In line with his new duties in this area, the Reverend Mr. Kellison will travel to the Church of Our Savior at Orlinda, Ontario, on October 27 to deliver the Occasional Sermon at the annual meeting of the Convention of Universalist Churches of Ontario.

## Local Church Group Helps Supply Mobile Civil Defense Clothing Van

Residents of the Farmington community will have an opportunity to see one of the latest additions to the state's Civil Defense program when a mobile clothing depot, sponsored by the Michigan Conference of Seventh-day-Adventists will be on display in Ferndale at 1545 Pinecrest.

The local Dorcas Welfare Society located at Grand River and Oxford Road is part of a chain of similar groups in Michigan that helps supply clothing and bedding for this mobile unit.

Stockpiles are maintained locally at the Dorcas center and, in case of emergency, can be dispatched for immediate use.

The church also has a stockpile of 50,000 garments at Grand Ledge. All of these articles are sorted, sized, kept in labeled boxes and ready for use, officials of the organization indicated.

The unit, consisting of a 30-foot van and tractor, has been fitted especially for emergency use. It is completely self-sufficient. This mobile depot has been approved by the Michigan Office of Civil Defense and carries the official CD emblem and emergency flashing lights.

The idea for the mobile unit came during the aftermath of the Grand Rapids tornado, where a moving van was used for clothing.

The gift boxes of candy, given as a part of the "Sweetest Day" program, being observed in Greater Detroit on this day. Many retail stores in the Detroit area are co-operating.

A total of 70 boys at Boys' Republic, 22,005 Inlander Road at Nine Mile, will receive boxes of candy as will 180 children at the Sarah Fisher Home, 37400 West Twelve Mile. Another 200 boxes of candy will be distributed to children at the Farmington Children's Hospital of Michigan, 30405 Grand River Cut-Off, and 48 children at the Detroit Cerebral Palsy Center located at the same address.
