comparable share of the expense in owning the project to become a reality.

The neighboring communities of West Bloomfield, Keego Harbor, Orchard Lake and parts of Southfield have expressed an interest in the project. In addition the City of Detroit has given a definite commitment for acceptance of the sewage, and the Board of Supervisors has hired a coordinator to work with the engineers of both the Evergreen and Farmington Interceptors in developing the systems.

City added that the remodeling of the Township offices has been completed with the exception of the installation of counters and partitions. Bids are still being accepted for the construction of a fireproof vault to house the records of the Township since the present facilities are inadequate. A committee has also been organized to secure possible sites for a new Township office as well as a Public Works Department.

The purchase of a road grader is being contemplated with the idea that it may alleviate some of the road conditions which can not be handled expediently by the Oakland County Road Commission. A planning code is in the process of being adopted and a traffic ordinance has recently been drafted and is expected to be adopted shortly.

**WORK STARTED ON PAVING VIOLET, LILAC STREETS**  
Excavation work was started this week in preparation for the paving of Violet Street and a part of Lilac Street, City Officials reported Monday.

Weather permitting, the actual laying of the concrete is expected to get underway late this week or early next week. It is anticipated that the entire project will be completed before freezing weather begins. The construction will include all of Violet Street from the northern city limits to Shawwassee. Part being excavated from the streets, is being used as fill for the future construction of a sidewalk along the south side of 10 Mile Road from Powers Road west to the 10 Mile Elementary School property, City Officials reported.

**New Art Training Highly Creative, Professor Says**  
Gone are the days when you walk into an elementary classroom and see a row of identical tulips above the blackboard, says Alex L. Pickens, instructor in art education in The University of Michigan College of Architecture and Design.

"You're more apt to see freshly brushed paintings in primary colors," he says. "Today's teacher doesn't ask the kids to trace snowflakes and paste them on windows as Christmas art projects, or to draw an apple just like the one on the blackboard."

Instead she's thinking in terms of what happens to the children as they create in paper or wood or clay. She's arriving at a deeper understanding of the creative act."

"First of all, Pickens says, 'the really up-to-date teacher knows the value of a creative school atmosphere. She encourages the children to take on responsibilities such as feeding a fish or bird, or watering plants, or preparing paints for an art activity.'"

"Second, she stimulates the children to express their own ideas and share them with others. This may take place during reading, when someone feels compelled to tell a story, or during an activity when crayons will not do the job and paint is an absolute necessity. In other words, she places the growth of the child ahead of schedule and the prescribed page in a text," Pickens says.

"Third, she's resourceful in providing a suitable environment for creative activities. Storage space lacking? The inventive teacher stretches plastic clothesline and creates display lines. She covers frames made in shop class with cotton felt or burlap and creates bulletin boards. Or she may hang display cases below the chalk trays or window ledges."

"Again," says Pickens, "She's resourceful about gathering new and unusual art materials. These may be nothing more than sawdust or asbestos cement to be mixed with wheat paste, or a bag of plaster and some field pebbles which will make a mosaic, or some scrap plastic which will be used in mounting leaf specimens or butterflies."

"Lastly," the art educator concludes, "she's wise enough to know that as her students approach adolescence more emphasis should be placed on manipulative art experiences. She shows her students how to master simple hand tools, to explore resistive materials and surfaces, and she answers their questions about perspective, color and horizons. At this level, she must provide a great variety of materials and activities," Pickens reminds.

**Good Breakfast Called A "Must" By Health Head**  
Parents and homemakers could well take a new look at health practices as they swing into the new fall and winter schedules, Dr. Joseph C. Molnar, commissioner of health, suggests.

An adequate breakfast is important for everyone in order to start the day right. Eating a good breakfast as a means of making a better school record is backed by studies made at the University of Iowa and other leading universities. The students who had a good breakfast turned out more work, were quicker in their reactions and did not tire as easily as children who came to school without breakfast.

In some of these studies, the attitudes of the students as well as their scholarship attainment was shown to be influenced by the kind of breakfast they ate.

A good breakfast should contain not less than one-fourth of the entire food requirements for the day, Dr. Molnar said. It should include fruit, milk, cereal, bread—whole wheat or enriched bread—and butter or margarine. An egg at least three to five times a week should be added. It is desirable to serve at least one hot food to give variety to the meal, he added.

Even in families where the mother works and must leave before the children have breakfast, planning can provide for their needs. With fresh fruit or an open can of fruit juice in the ice box, and with milk, bread and softened butter, and a choice of cereal, even a very young child can manage his own breakfast on a "do-it-yourself" basis, said the health commissioner. The secret of success here is that there must be prior planning to have the food in the right place and the child properly instructed.

Dr. Molnar says, "A hungry child cannot learn as well as one who is fed. It is a disadvantage in his relationship with others, so send him to school with a good breakfast, eaten without rush or tension."

**Hot Spiced Apple Cider Is Tasty**  
A hot spicy punch is part of many fall parties, whether they include youngsters or grown-ups. Food specialists at Michigan State University point out that while apple cider is plentiful, you can make good use of it.

Mulled or spiced apple cider, served steaming hot, will warm both the body and the spirit. For five servings use about one quart of sweet apple cider, eight whole cloves, one-fourth cup of sugar and a few grains of salt. You might also want to add a stick of cinnamon or bark with cinnamon sticks in the glass.

The secret of good mulled or spiced cider is to heat it slowly—so slowly that it takes about a half an hour for a quart to come to a boil.

For a hot spiced cider variation, try adding slices of one lemon to the above mixture before heating. Allow the lemon slices to remain in the cider when it is served. This adds to the appearance of the drink, and the tart flavor is pleasing.

If you want to serve something different, try mulled grape juice. Prepare it like the spiced cider. Heated pineapple juice served with cinnamon sticks is another suggestion of the food specialists.
