Motion made by Calkins supported by Cavanaugh that Gas Franchise Ordinance be adopted as follows: AN ORDINANCE, granting to CONSUMERS POWER COMPANY, its successors and assigns, the right, power and authority to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges and other public places, and to do a local gas business in the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, for a period of thirty years.

State Forest Fire Losses Mounting

Michigan faces a serious forest fire threat as thousands of hunters seek outdoor recreation in tinder-dry woodlands and fields. Recent dry, warm weather has greatly increased the hazard of fire in most areas of the state. Last week's fire record, one of the worst of the year, listed 58 fires which damaged 289 acres. The latest fires boosted the annual damage figure to 2673 acres.

Pheasant Kills Down Sharply

Fewer birds, less success and about the same number of hunters was the picture during the first week of pheasant season. A late wet spring was blamed for reducing the total pheasant population somewhat this year. Ringneck nests were rained out or washed away, and broods that survived were in general, produced later in the season. Many of these late nesters were still immature and uncolored and provided few targets for hunters.
