**St. Paul's Lutheran Mission Planned November 11-15**

Members of the St. Paul's Lutheran Church will participate in a series of "Preaching, Teaching, and Reaching" program of Christian evangelism from November 11 to 15, Pastor Reverend W. Rukowsky, disclosed this week.

Integrated into a national program of this year's "Venture of Faith" of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, the local effort is being sponsored by more than 60 Lutheran parishes in Greater Detroit.

Highlight of the entire effort will be the "Preaching" part of the program in conjunction with a schedule of informal worship services to be held in the individual churches each evening from Sunday through Thursday.

St. Paul's Lutheran Church services will begin at 8:00 p.m. A series of addresses will be given by the Reverend Richard Riss, guest minister from Conklin, Michigan.

The city-wide effort will get underway with a mass rally service in the new Henry Ford Auditorium on Sunday, November 11, at 3:00 p.m., Reverend Rukowsky said.

"Teaching" emphasis will consist of a daily school for pastors each morning in designated east and west-side churches and a training period for laymen and women at the participating churches each evening preceding the service.

A neighborhood canvass, followed by special invitation calls on the unchurched and interested, is the immediate aim of the "Reaching" part of this "Crusade for Christ."

Information classes on the teaching and practices of the Lutheran Church will be held following the week's effort.

## Dr. Frank Adams, Wife To Serve Church In Iowa

Minister Emeritus of the Farmington Universalist Church, Dr. Frank Adams and his wife, the Reverend Helen Follett Adams, have gone to Waterloo, Iowa, to serve the Universalist Church there as interim ministers until a permanent minister is appointed.

Both Dr. and Mrs. Adams are well known in the middle west, as well as in Michigan. Dr. Adams was ordained in 1905 at Avon, Illinois, and was minister of Universalist Churches at Elgin, Urbana and Oak Park, Illinois. Mrs. Adams was ordained in 1918 and became minister of the Urbana Church while Dr. Adams was chaplain in the United States Army.

In Michigan Dr. Adams has been pastor of The Church of Our Father in Detroit, of the Universalist Church of Pontiac and of the Universalist Church of Farmington. He has served as President of the Universalist Churches of Michigan Convention. During the early 1930's he was a member of the Mayor of Detroit's Committee on Unemployment.

Dr. Adams is the author of a number of books on religion such as: "Glimpses of Grandeur," "God and Company, Unlimited," "Rediscovered Countries," "Dial Jesus Mean It?" and "Dare We Meet the Challenge?"

Members and friends of the Farmington Universalist Church miss the inspiration of their presence, and look forward to their return next January.

## No Room For Prejudice In Christianity

ON a missionary journey in the town of Antioch in Pisidia, Paul was in the synagogue on the Sabbath, preaching a sermon. It made such an impression upon the gathering that they invited Paul back to preach at the following Sabbath.

Apparently the fame of Paul had spread throughout the city, and a great company—not all of them Jews—gathered to hear him the second time.

Trouble developed. It was the sort of trouble that usually develops when someone with a new gospel, or a new emphasis, comes preaching and gains a hearing. He quickly aroused either the jealousy or opposition of the constituted religious authorities.

It was the sort of thing that John Wesley encountered time and again in his itinerant preaching in England.

But the opposition of the Jews in Antioch had a very important result. When Paul saw the interest aroused among the Gentiles in the city, he turned from the Jews, who were unwilling to hear him, to preach to the Gentiles.

The point to be made here is this: The Christian experience is not limited to either Jew or Gentile. In Christ, there is neither Jew nor Greek, neither bond nor free, neither male nor female. All are one.

This is the essential teaching of Christianity—so different from even Christians to grasp and practice. It strikes at the very root of all narrowness and bigotry and prejudice. And, at the same time, it asserts the only sort of unity that can be real and genuine.
