

Students To Run Livonia For Day

On Monday, November 26, Livonia City officials will be visiting their offices for a day in favor of students from Bentley, Ladywood, and Clarenceville High Schools.

On this day, students elected to the various offices will handle the duties of the city officials. They will be assigned on a rotating basis so that each school will have a representative. This year, Bentley High School will choose the substitutes for mayor, three councilmen, and constable. Clarenceville High School's representatives will preside as city treasurer, councilmen, municipal judge and constable. Ladywood High School will send students to serve as city clerks.

Primary elections in each school will result in the nomination of two candidates for each office. On Monday, November 19, the candidates will campaign in an assembly at all schools.

On Wednesday, November 21 a general election will be held. This election for Clarenceville High School will be sponsored by the Student Council.

G. O. P. Favored In Mock Election

Results of a mock election held at Clarenceville High School, Thursday, October 25, gave the Republican party a sweeping majority of victories. The final ballot count placed GOP men in all offices except that of Governor of Michigan.

Approximately 60 per cent of the student body at Clarenceville took part in the mock election. The students used the voting machine and followed official election procedure in electing their choice of candidates. This event, sponsored by the Student Council, was a lesson in government and election procedure. In the final tabulation, Dwight D. Eisenhower received a total of 187 votes to Adlai Stevenson's 123. Governor Williams tallied 197 and Albert Cobo collected 133.

Four years ago, during the 1952 election, Clarenceville High School held a similar mock election. The result of that election followed exactly the trend of the voting public in this area.

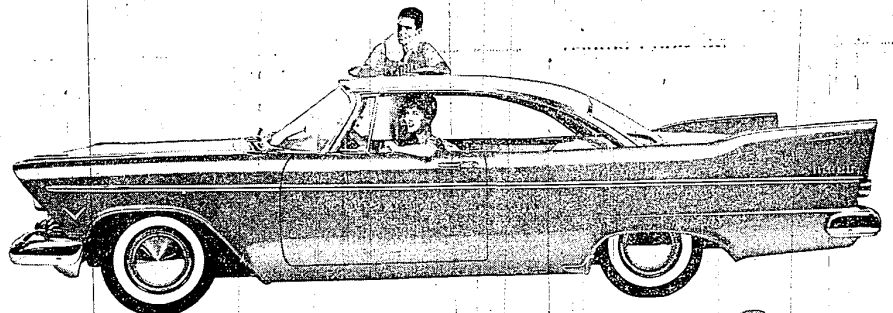
