

Teen Crime Film, Discussion Set For Nov. 15

Residents of the Farmington area have been invited to attend a showing of the full-length Hollywood film, "Crime in the Streets," on November 15, in Pontiac.

The Oakland County Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers is presenting the film. It will be shown at the Pontiac State Hospital Auditorium, November 15, at 8 p.m.

"Crime in the Streets" is a story of juvenile delinquency and family disintegration, starring Sal Mineo, James Whitmore and John Cassavetes. The film has been loaned to the National Association of Social Workers as a public service by Allied Artists Pictures of Michigan. There is no charge for the program.

Following the film there will be a panel discussion by prominent social workers regarding teenage problems, the parental role and the responsibility of educators, social agencies and church authorities. The function of the various types of social agencies and the place of social workers in the present day culture will also be discussed.
