West Bloomfield Trojans Play To 0-0 Tie Friday

The Clarenceville Trojan football team ended a mediocre season last Friday evening on their home field by playing the West Bloomfield to a 0-0 tie.

Play throughout the contest was characterized by strong defensive play by both teams. Neither team was able to push over although both made threats throughout the game.

In six contests, the Trojans fell just short of compiling an even won-lost record. They won two games while losing three and tying the one. It was a big let-down from last year, when the Trojans, though small and with limited material to draw from, walked off with the Wayne-Oakland League title.

The contest Friday night was the last for five seniors at Clarenceville High. Playing their last game for the Trojans were Dave Hanford, Delbert L. Timmerlake, Richard Carey and Ralph Wasack.

Christmas Seals Now Available

Christmas Seals are now available for overseas mail, and packages and will be available for parcels mailed in the United States shortly. Irving L. Goldman, chairman of the 50th annual Christmas Seal Sale, announced. The U.S. Post Office is urging that overseas mail be sent prior to November 15.

The 1956 Christmas Seal has an overseas history. The original Christmas Seal was designed by a postal clerk in Denmark where the stamps were used to raise money for children with tuberculosis. A few years later the idea came to life in the United States when the first Christmas Seal Sale was held in Delaware to raise money for tuberculosis victims.

Heidi Brandt, Colorado Springs, Colorado designer of this year's Seal, always has a Danish background, her parents being Danish. Mrs. Brandt, the mother of three sons, was returning from Europe aboard the Stockholm when it and the Andrea Doria collided at sea. She had been studying art in Germany under a Fulbright scholarship.

"The 1956 Seals are designed to illustrate the spirit of the 50th annual Christmas Seal. Children march across each sheet of Seals carrying the double-barred cross, the symbol of the fight against tuberculosis, into the future. Two Seals, one showing a little girl and the other an appealing little boy, both dressed in green, make up the pattern," Mr. Goldman pointed out.

"The Christmas Seal children do not look backward. There is no time to pause for celebration of the triumphs over TB in the past 50 years while there is still a big job ahead to bring under control this disease which creeps into our homes and robs so many of health and happiness," the chairman said.
