**Bible Comment:**  
**Religion Too Often Used for Selfish Ends**  
**CHRISTIANITY** made "such progress in the ancient city of Ephesus that the worshippers of Diana became alarmed. The alarm particularly concerned those who were making a commercial business out of religion. These craftsmen could not have had much success if they had said to the public, 'These men are endangering our business.' Their self-interest would have been made altogether too apparent. Instead they uttered the great cry that the worship of Diana was being endangered, and they stirred up mob violence with the rallying slogan, 'Great is Diana of the Ephesians.' How true is this to every age! It may be some form of commercialism, but it is worthy and legitimate, or some worthy and vicious thing. When profits are endangered, those whose interests are affected almost always hide behind some pretense of principle or conviction.

It may be a plea of personal liberty; it may be patriotism; it may be some form of religious profession or prejudice. But examine closely, and you will find self-interest at the heart of the thing. Fortunately, it has not always been so. There have been great occasions in history when individuals and groups have been able to rise above self-interest, and see issues in terms of social and moral reality. It is these who manifest the spirit of true religion. A man's religion ceases to be worthy the moment his motive to make a profit from his faith becomes paramount.

Let us beware lest the noble ideal of religious conviction be tarnished by those who say "our religion" when they mean "our selves." There is nothing finer than saying "our religion" when we mean it and when our devotion matches our profession.
