Sixty-One Falcon Basketball Hopefuls Answer Opening Call

Opening basketball call at Farmington High last Thursday was answered by 61 hopefuls.

Before actual workouts got underway, Coaches Burtch and Graham outlined training rules for the hopefuls and urged the boys to put extra emphasis on early conditioning.

Returning this year will be several boys who saw action last year on either the varsity or junior varsity squads. A big boost to the varsity squad's hopes this year will be the return of Bud Jones and Don MacDonald. These two regulars were high scorers for the Falcons cagers last year, racking in 208 and 173 points respectively.

In commenting on the team this year, varsity coach Burtch said, "My optimistic prediction for this season is that we'll do about the same as last year. We have a good team, but the other schools in the league we play in have plenty of power also."

Last year the Falcons broke even in play with eight victories against eight losses. The record was good for fourth place in the Inter-Lakes conference.

The Falcons were beaten twice by Walled Lake, Wayne and Berkley, while splitting in contests.

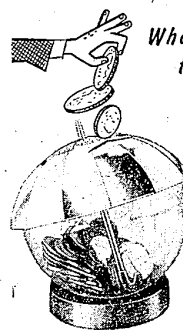
Opponents to the Trotters will be the Washington Generals, who are famous for their ever-present hustle and well-coordinated style of play.

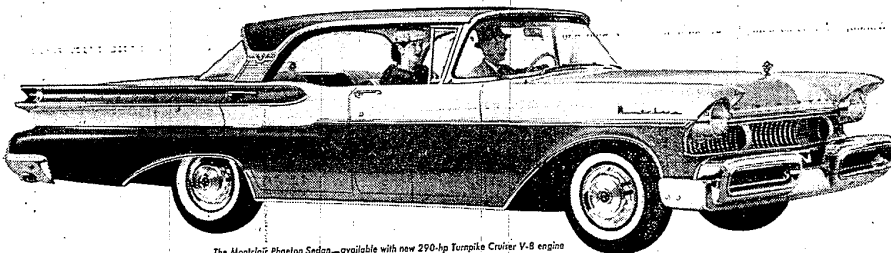

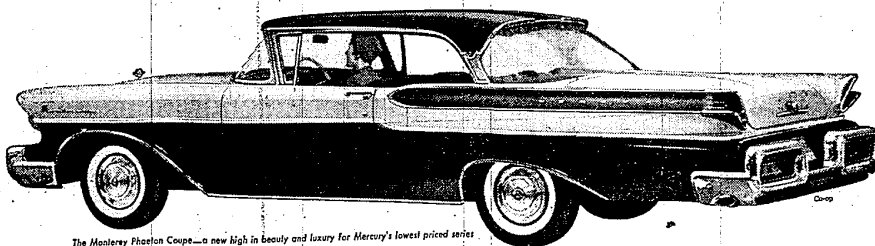
