All indicated that they enjoyed the service and the fine hospital-

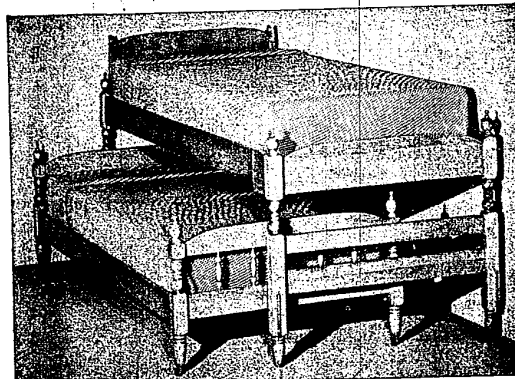

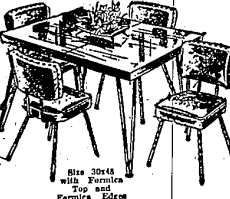

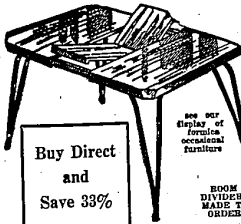
