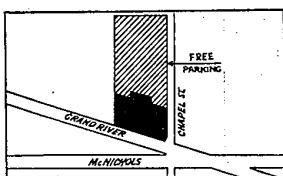

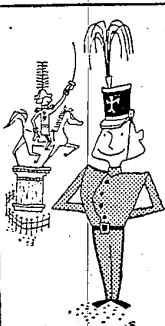
Mrs. Jack Helrick, who has been in Mt. Carmel Hospital for the past two weeks for observation and surgery, returned to her home last Saturday.

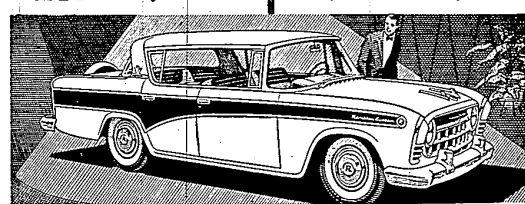

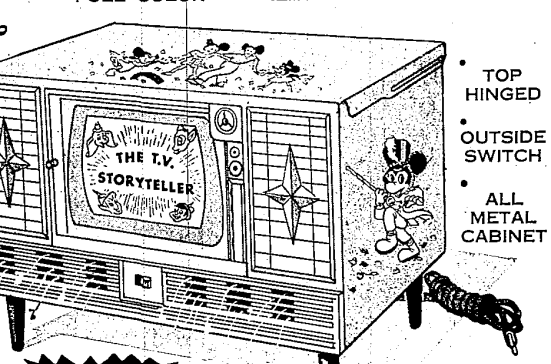
