Army Intelligence Positions Open

Captain Robert L. Toupin, 34520
Fendt, Farmington, of the Military
Intelligence Service of the Army
Reserves, announced this week that
qualified men between the ages of
17 to 35 are now being accepted for
training in linguistic and non-linguistic
units.

Captain Toupin, army reserve in-
telligence recruit officer at Fort
Wayne, said qualified men would
be assigned to language, editorial,
photographic, administrative and
order of battle teams.

Toupin said young men between
the ages of 17 and 35 can enlist
for a deferred eight year duty
serving six months on active duty
and seven and a half years in the
ready reserve, under the armed
forces reserve act of 1955. They will
also spend eight weeks at the Army
Intelligence Center, Fort Holabird,
Maryland.

Reserve enlistments are being
taken every Thursday, 7:30 to 9:30
p.m. at Fort Wayne, 6301 West
Jefferson, Detroit.

Defensive Driving Cuts Accidents

Defensive driving has again been
spotlighted as the key to safe driv-
ing, in the current Courtesy and
Safety campaign of Michigan's
trucking industry.

Defensive driving, as defined by
Frank Baird-Smith, president of
the Michigan Trucking Association,
is the consistent practice of driv-
ing in such a manner as to allow
for errors on the part of other
drivers and pedestrians. In this
way, an accident can be avoided by
forethought.

"Every driver should develop the
habit of observing traffic move-
ment as far ahead as possible,"
Baird-Smith said.

"This type of driving will go a
long way towards cutting down the
number of chain-reaction accidents
which now plague our highways,"
Baird-Smith concluded.
