Under the supervision of Mrs. John Forney, director of youth work, the Universalist Church is now carrying on an interesting and varied program for the young folks of high school age.

The "Sooner or Later" as the group is called, is struggling with the humorously expressed but challenging problem of "Why Me Is I."

Besides consideration of this general topic, things of specific interest, such as what to do when one grows up, are studied.

So far this fall two professionals have been studied with the assistance of adult members. Dr. Thomas F. Hout, assistant professor of sociology at Wayne State University, discussed "Teaching as a Career." Dr. Russell Costello, neurophysiologist at Wayne County General Hospital and a member of the faculty of Wayne State Medical School, pointed out the requirements to be met by those planning to enter the field of medicine.

Starting on December 16, Don and Helen Hill, who have conducted dancing classes at Eastern Detroit YMCA and the YWCA in Wyandotte, will conduct a series of classes in social dancing. The Hills are professional dance instructors.

A series of films selected by Mrs. Harley Gibson, director of religious education, having special interest to young folks, will be presented in January. Titles of the films will be announced later.

Contributions To Church Small, Study Reveals

The bulk of church members give little more than, pittance to keep their churches going, according to a recent copyrighted article in a leading national magazine.

The overwhelming majority of giving is on a \$1-a-week basis, the article pointed out. But many occasional church attenders contribute as little as \$2 a year for the support of the church to which they are anxious to come on Christmas and Easter.

Of the ten Protestant churches receiving the greatest total contributions, Presbyterians (U.S.) gave the most, an average of \$75.54 per member a year. Lutherans (Missouri Synod) were next with \$67.82 and Presbyterians (U.S.A.), third, with an average member contribution of \$61.47. The other seven churches were: Congregational, \$54.76; Protestant Episcopal, \$51.84; Lutheran (United), \$50.25; Baptist (American Convention), \$43.17; Baptist (Missouri Synod), \$43.17; Methodist, \$37.33; and Disciples of Christ, \$34.77.
