(Continued from Page 1A) Therefore, more interest rates on mortgages will be higher in 1957. Loans not "federally" guaranteed will require larger margins.

22. Real estate in large cities will continue to decline in price due to lack of parking facilities.

23. Suburban real estate will continue active, but fewer new houses will be built. Houses will be for sale by executives who have lost their well-paid jobs.

24. Purchasers will give more attention to the state of the lots than to the houses. Better locations can be secured by buying existing houses. Modern kitchens will become a "must."

25. Acreage near proposed shopping centers will be excellent for speculation. The automobile will continue to raise havoc with real estate prices, helping some locations and hurting others.

26. New inventions in connection with heating, lighting, and other features will make most older houses obsolete.
