judgment. Only a self-reliant people can be free. Dependence upon government destroys individual freedom.

Woodrow Wilson said: "Freedom exists only where the people take care of the government." Then the government belongs to them, and not they to the government. Long before Wilson's day, thinkers were speaking out on the subject of self-reliance as the source of independence of freedom. Bunyan in Pilgrim's Progress spoke of it; so did Shakespeare in Hamlet and Macbeth. One of the best known words on the subject was written anonymously:

"Leave to heaven, in humble trust,
All you will to do;
But if you succeed, you must
Paddle your own canoe."
Eternal Virtues

This harks back to the old McGuffey's readers, and their axiom on thrift, self-reliance and the other great human attributes. Self-reliance, however, isn't so old-fashioned that it should be discarded—unless, as Wilson noted, we are ready to discard freedom.

Every citizen would be strengthening freedom in the U.S.A. if during this January he resolves that in 1957 he will be more nearly self-reliant, that he will stand on his own two feet, that he will contribute to the care of government, and not accept care from the government so long as he is able-bodied. How about it?

The regular meeting of the Clarenceville High School PTA to be held on Tuesday evening at 8 p.m. at the high school will feature a talk by Ralph Chester Wenrich, professor of vocational education and chairman of the department of vocational education and practical arts at the University of Michigan.

Professor Wenrich will speak on the topic, "Should the Schools Prepare Youth to Earn a Living or to Live a Life?"

Born in Pennsylvania, Wenrich received both his bachelor and master of science degrees from Pennsylvania State University. He first joined the faculty of the University for one semester in 1940, as lecturer in vocational education. From 1946-1950, he was in the Michigan Department of Public Instruction, where he served as Associate State Superintendent of Public Instruction and State Director of Vocational Education.

He has been professor of vocational education and chairman of the State Department of Vocational Education since 1950.

He is co-author of a book on Vocational Education and Practical Arts in the Community School, published by MacMillan in 1956.

Professor Wenrich is a member of Kappa Psi Kappa, Iota Lambda Sigma, Phi Delta Kappa, Nu Sigma Phi, Michigan Education Society and the American Vocational Association.
