New Form Out To Make Income Tax Filing Easier

As a result of surveys and studies conducted by the Internal Revenue Service, several million taxpayers who last year filed their returns on Form 1040 are this year receiving in the mail the simplified punch-card Form 1040A, which makes possible easier preparation of a return and can be more readily processed by the Service, it was reported.

The card form enables the taxpayer to provide all pertinent information on his income and exemption status, if his income was less than \$5,000 during 1956, consisting of salary or wages from which tax was withheld.

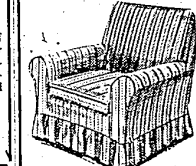
Last year approximately 15 million taxpayers who could have used the card form actually used the longer Form 1040 in order to calculate their additional tax or refund before filing their returns.

Provision of the Form 1040A with this new feature will enable people to accomplish the same purpose with the simplified card form, the Internal Revenue Department indicated.

Plant 8 Million Trees In State

Nearly 8,000,000 trees were planted on state lands during 1956, the highest total since 1940 the Conservation Department reported. The plantings were made on 8000 acres of public forests.

The high total is indication that state nurseries, on which the trees were grown, have regained the high production rate they held prior to World War II.

During the war, the nurseries suffered from lack of manpower; and the public was unable to plant trees in quantity for the same reason.

Noir, however, the nurseries have caught up with the public demand for young trees for reforestation, and have enough surplus stock to warrant the increased planting on state lands.

The record high planting was made in 1931, when 21,000,000 young trees were planted on state land.

Proposes Bill To Set Up Commission To Aid Aged

Because the aging of our population is a continuous and dynamic process, Senator Charles E. Potter, Republican of Michigan, today introduced a bill to establish a ten-man Commission on the Aging and Aged.

"My bill is designed to capitalize on a potential national asset of great magnitude," Senator Potter stated. "Today one out of every thirteen Americans is 65 years of age or older. By 1970 we expect to have 21 million older citizens. Too many of these people, because they are older, are pushed aside from the mainstream of community life."

The proposed Commission would study the problems of the aged, assist in finding solutions, and recommend integrated action on the following: employment and employability, income, maintenance, health and physical care, housing, living arrangements and family relationships, effective use of leisure time.

Car Buyers Face Higher Prices, Stiff Financing

Those who set out to purchase a new car in 1957 may find that they will be forced to wind up with a smaller, lower-priced car than they intended to buy, according to editors of a leading national magazine.

The reasons, they state, are that interest rates are higher for car financing; down payments will be stiffer; borrowers may have to repay loans faster, in bigger installments, and finally, lenders are choosier about how much they will lend and to whom.

Car prices are the highest in history, they indicated, with price increases as much as \$80 to \$180 over last year's levels in the low priced cars. This combination of high prices and tough financing will force many buyers into the lower priced, standard models, they conclude.
