A low temperature for roasting meat is an oven temperature of 325 degrees Fahrenheit. When braising a chuck roast, use the top of range heat; after the roast is browned and the liquid added, low temperature for cooking meats keeps the flavor and juice inside and assures no burning or smoking fat drippings. Low temperature keeps the meat from shrinking and gives a large piece of meat of serving time, says the Consumer Marketing Information Agent, Mrs. Josephine Lawler.


