Use low temperatures for cooking. An extra precaution for cooking meat in the oven is a meat thermometer. The meat thermometer, inserted in the roast according to directions, will tell when the roast is done. There will be no smoke, and no over-cooked meat.

It is necessary that all dog owners in Oakland County must produce a certificate that their dog (or dogs) has been vaccinated against rabies within the last 12 months before township residents or city residents of Walled Lake or Keego Harbor can receive a 1957 dog license from their respective treasurers.

Local Meat Market Opened Under New Management

The meat market located at 34115 Grand River Avenue, formerly known as Farmington Meats, was opened the latter part of last month under new management.

The store, now known as Barney's Quality Meats, was purchased by Barney Podolski of Centerline, Michigan, from Jack Goose, former owner. Podolski and his wife, the former Grace Marsh of Farmington, are managing the store jointly.

Podolski has had considerable experience in the handling and retail selling of meats. He was employed in the meat department of a Kroger store in Detroit for approximately 15 years and spent four years in the meat department at the Roy Sherwood Market in Detroit.

"Emphasis will be placed on maintaining a clean market, serving a complete line of top quality meats and rendering the best possible service to all customers at all times," Podolski stated.

Though the store will specialize in meats, Podolski indicated, a small line of stock grocery items and produce items will also be available at the store.

An added feature at the store is a barbecue service. Barbecued chicken, turkey and spare ribs will be offered and orders taken anytime for pickup during store hours, Podolski said.
