To the Qualified Electors of TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON COUNTY OF OAKLAND STATE OF MICHIGAN

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law," the undersigned Clerk, will, upon any day, except Sunday and a legal holiday, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter in said Township, City or Village not already registered who may APPLY TO ME PERSONALLY for such registration. Provided, however, that I can receive no names for registration during the time intervening between the Thirtieth day before any regular, special or official primary election and the day of such election.

Notice Is Hereby Given That I Will Be at My Office

Monday, March 4, 1957 - Last Day

The Thirtieth day preceding said Election

As Provided by Section 498, Act No. 116, Public Acts of 1954

From 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m. on said day for the purpose of REVIEWING the REGISTRATION and REGISTERING such of the qualified electors in said TOWNSHIP, CITY or VILLAGE as SHALL PROPERLY apply therefor.

The name of no person but an ACTUAL RESIDENT of the precinct at the time of registration, and entitled under the Constitution, if remaining such residents, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration book.

ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE

SEC. 504. Any elector who is unable to make personal application because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which is located his legal residence, duplicate registration cards and executing in duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other officer authorized to administer oaths and returning such registration cards to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration prior to any election or primary election. The notary public or other officer administering the oath shall sign his name on the line for the signature of registration officer and designate his title.

UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE

SEC. 491. The inspectors of election at any election or primary election in this State, in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in the registration book of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P. A. 1954.)

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION, APPLICATION, TIME

SEC. 505. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer and presenting to the Clerk the last address card and precinct number and record the new address, ward and precinct number on the original and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in proper precinct file. Such transfers shall not be made within the (30) days next preceding any election or primary election, (unless such 30th day shall fall on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday in which case registration shall be accepted during the next full working day), provided that no such transfer shall permit any person to vote in any Township, City or Village in which he has not resided (30) days next preceding any election or primary election.

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY

SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village shall have the right to make application to have his registration transferred on any election or primary election day by executing a request for transfer to the election board in the precinct in which he is registered. Upon receiving such request the inspector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature record and if the signatures correspond then the inspector shall certify such fact upon said request and the applicant for transfer shall then be permitted to vote in such precinct for that election only. The application for transfer shall be filed with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer such registration in accordance with the application. When the name of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change to show the proper name of street in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.

Falcons Lose To Berkley 50-43, Walled Lake, Bears Tie For First

The Berkley Bears last Friday showed why they are tied with Walled Lake for first place as they defeated the Falcons a 50-43 defeat. Walled Lake held their share of the top rung by going into overtime to squeeze by Waterford.

Top man in scoring for the evening was Bruce Macdonald's "Don" MacDonald with 15 points. Berkley's top fellow, Jim Zaleski, was runner up with 13 in his three periods of play. The Bear's top scorer was third with 10 and the Falcon's Bud Jones scored nine.

Dave Weather, Tom Kestly and Jerry Macdonald scored eight, six and three respectively for Farmington.

The ball changed hands often in the first period. Berkley going ahead in the final seconds on a basket by Zaleski.

The lung arms of the Bear's Nieder, Vincent and Zelenko out-reached the Falcons to assume effective backboard control in the second period. Berkley's tough defense held the Falcons to a meager first shots for eight points after half time.

Billy outclassed at the start of the fourth quarter. The Blue and White caught fire and scored 19, led by Jacobson's seven. Even with the top quarter score of either team, the Bears had

enough of a lead to keep the Falcons out of tying range.

Still in second place, the Falcons plus Walled Lake tomorrow night and end the season against Waterford on March 1.

Bear five held control of the ball throughout most of the game. This coupled with deadly accurate shooting from out-court proved too much for the Falcons to cope with. Berkley and Walled Lake remain in a deadlock for first place in the Inter-Lakes Conference, with Farmington just one notch behind the two top teams.
