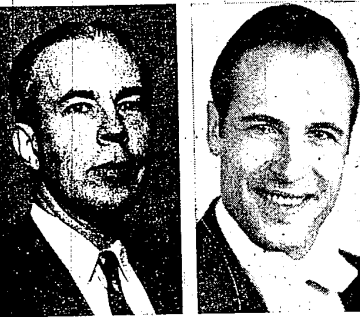
In almost every instance the fire originated from sparks flying from a trash burner. In every case the fire department's prompt arrival prevented real disaster.
